Since 1984, John Morse has been the head coach of Nashville Aquatic Club in Nashville, TN, establishing a tradition of dedication and excellence, earning 10 consecutive Gold Medal Club honors. He was named the 1989, 2001, 2002, 2004, 2008 and 2009 Southeastern Swimming LSC Coach of the Year and trained his team to over 40 LSC Championship titles.

NAC had 18 athletes with ties to NAC at the 2012 Olympic Trials, with 14 representing the club. When asked how he felt his athletes did at the meet, he said "As a team, one of our goals was to earn two semifinal swims. Our athletes earned both of those semifinals, as well as a spot in a final. All things considered, I'd say our team met many of our goals."


Olympic Trials never fail to disappoint as we watch the best of the best vie for a spot on the Olympic team. When we asked which race John enjoyed

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QUARTERLY HIGHLIGHTS

OLYMPIC SWIMMING TRIALS

The United States once again set the swimming world on fire during the 2012 Olympic Trials in Omaha. Nike was represented on deck by 38 teams and more than 130 athletes at what would prove to be the fastest meet in the world this year.

In one of the greatest races of the competition, Nikesponsored Delaware Swim Team's Andrew Gemmell took the victory in the men's 1500. With 50 meters to go, Andrew outsprinted Connor Jaeger to finish just 4 tenths of a second ahead and earn his place in London for the United States Olympic team. Congratulations to Andrew and his coach and father, Bruce!

Joining Andrew in London was Nike's own Cullen Jones. Cullen was able to fight back to win the 50 Freestyle by 1/100th of a second over 2000 Olympic Gold Medalist Anthony Ervin. He also placed 2nd in the 100 Freestyle which guarantees him a spot on the legendary 400 Freestyle Relay.

- Amanda Kendall (Makos) 16th in the 100 Free and 13th in the 100 Butterfly
- Katy Freeman (SBAC) 11th in the 200 Breastroke

Top 20 finishes on the men's side were scored by:

- · Hayes Johnson (NAC) 20th in the 200 Backstroke
- Josh Prenot (SMSC) 10th in the 200 Breastroke, 14th in the 200 I.M. and 14th in the 400 I.M.
- Justin Lynch (Terrapin) 18th in the 200 Butterfly
- Dakota Hodgson (NAC) 6th in the 200 Butterfly

OLYMPIC DIVING TRIALS

The U.S. Olympic Diving Trials were a tremendous success for all our Nike teams! The diving trials were held in Federal Way, WA at the Weyerhaeuser King County Aquatic Center, home of the 2000 Olympic Diving Trials. This competitive drama-filled event took place June 17-24 where approximately 120 of the Nation's best divers competed for 14 spots on the U.S. Olympic team. The trials were buzzing with excitement as we all anxiously watched and waited to see how those spots would be filled. The talent, hard work and dedication of all contenders were seen by all as five out of the 14 Olympic positions were filled by divers on Nike sponsored teams. Way to go divers!

Congratulations to Stanford divers Cassidy Krug and Kristian Ipsen for earning their first spots on the U.S. Olympic Team. Cassidy had three outstanding performances, landing her a first place finish in the 3m springboard. Her teammate Kristian made the team the following night when he and partner Troy Dumais took the gold in the 3m synchro. Christina Loukas from Woodlands Diving Academy earned a spot on her second Olympic team as she took a silver medal in the women's 3m event trailing shortly behind Krug. Another second time Olympian, Kelci Bryant from Minnesota Diving, won the women's 3m synchro event securing her spot on the team as well. Our final qualifier, Chris Colwill from Georgia Diving, won the men's 3m event in one of the best and closest contests of the trials.

THE 2012 LONDON OLYMPICS!

SWIMMING

Congratulations to two outstanding athletes, Andrew Gemmell and Cullen Jones for their impressive results at the 2012 Olympic Games. Andrew finished 9th in the heats of the 1500m freestyle swimming under 15 minutes once again with a time of 14:59.05. Cullen swam proudly for team USA bringing home 3 medals. He took the silver medal in the 50 Freestyle with a best time from any American this year of 21.54. He was also a part of 2 relay teams. Cullen split 47.60 on the 3rd leg of the 4x100 Freestyle Relay Final that finished in 2nd place, and then split a 48.12 in the heats of the 4x100 Medley Relay that went on to capture the gold medal.

DIVING

After many stellar performances at the 2012 Olympic diving trials in Seattle our 5 Nike divers headed to London to compete on the world's biggest athletic stage. In the first event of the diving competition the 3m Women's Synchro, Kelci Bryant from Minnesota Diving turned in an amazing performance that landed her a spot on the awards stand with the silver medal. The second event of the meet was the Men's 3m Synchro where Stanford diver Kristian Ipsen took the bronze in his first Olympics. He and synchro partner Troy Dumais executed five flawless dives that put them on the medal stand. Christina Loukas from the Woodlands Diving and Cassidy Krug from Stanford Diving both had outstanding performances in the Women's 3m final. Respectively, Cassidy Krug took 7th place and Christina Loukas trailed shortly behind her in 8th place. Also competing on the 3m for the men was Chris Colwill from Georgia Diving. Overall, the meet went off without a splash!


